

Application and Audition Procedures for Graduate Music Degrees

Please read through this document carefully and completely.

Most, if not all, of the questions you will have are answered here. Incomplete applications will not be reviewed for admission.

The University of Kansas School of Music offers the following graduate degrees: Master of Music (MM), Doctor of Musical Arts (DMA), and Doctor of Philosophy (PhD). The MM degree is offered in Conducting, Composition, Church Music, Musicology, Music Theory and Performance. The DMA degree is offered in Conducting, Composition, Church Music and Performance. The PhD is offered in Music Theory and Musicology.

Application Deadlines

December 1: Priority consideration deadline for MM, DMA, or PhD students interested in University Fellowships or Graduate Teaching Assistantships. Entry is for the Fall term.

February 15: Final consideration deadline for MM, DMA, and PhD students interested in Graduate Teaching Assistantships (if positions are still available). Entry is for the Fall term.

May 1: Final deadline for all applicant admission materials for review and possible entry in the summer or the fall term.

Non-Degree Applicants (ONLY) A description can be found in the Graduate Catalog. This admission status is not for full time study.

May 1: Deadline for all admission materials for review and possible entry in either the summer or fall terms.

December 1: Deadline for all admission materials for review and possible entry in the spring term.

Required Documents/Information

Your application will not be considered complete until you have provided the following:

- Graduate Studies Application Form:** www.graduate.ku.edu/application-process
- Application Fee:** This is a non-refundable processing fee. Online application fees are paid electronically during the online process. See the application fee chart on page 3 for actual amounts.
- Transcripts:** An official transcript must be sent directly from all previous colleges or universities showing college level course work. These transcripts must be received by either the admissions office or the School of Music Graduate Services office to process the application for admission. If you have not yet graduated, an additional final transcript showing the degree conferred must be sent before the end of your first semester at KU.
- TOEFL/IELTS scores:** International students only – see page 4. These must be official scores sent from the testing agency to the University of Kansas (Code: 6871)
- Reference Letters:** Three letters of recommendation regarding your qualifications for graduate study in your selected program, less than two years old, must be received. The form is sent to your references through the online process.
- Résumé or curriculum vitae:** List scholarships/fellowships, awards, and history of employment and employment since bachelor's degree, beginning with the most recent employment.
- Repertoire List:** List of all pieces that have been prepared for performance (Performance applicants only).
- Additional documents:** Additional materials are required for some majors, degrees or international students. Review all applicable sections on pages 2-4 for specific information.
- Auditions:** All candidates seeking the MM in performance or church music, or the DMA in performance or church music must perform an audition. Voice and Piano applicants must submit a pre-screening audition. Late auditions will be considered on a space available basis. Audition requirements and faculty contact information begin on page 5.

Additional Required Documents for Regular Admission

Music Theory and Musicology Master's and PhD programs

- Grade point average of 3.0 or better in all previous degree programs**
- GRE Scores: Required for all Musicology graduate applicants and Music Theory PhD applicants.** Submit scores for the three basic aptitude subtests (Verbal, Quantitative, and Analytical Writing). These scores are required. Registration for the GRE is done online through the ETS website at www.ets.org. Select GRE under the main menu and follow the directions to register for the test. Request that scores be submitted to yourself and the University of Kansas using code 6871.
- Scholarly Writing Samples**

Composition Programs

- At least 3 Original Scores and recordings of your music if available**

Conducting Programs

- CD:** A performance CD of an ensemble that the applicant has trained.
- DVD:** A DVD that shows the applicant conducting at least two compositions in performance and two compositions in rehearsal. The conductor must be in full frontal or partial profile view and at least part of the ensemble must be in view. The repertoire selected for the video must be appropriate to the musical and technical abilities of the ensemble.

Readmission of returning graduate students

- If you have been on an official Leave of Absence, please send an email to jgnojek@ku.edu with a request to be returned from the Leave.
- If you have not been enrolled for one academic year (three consecutive semesters including Summer), you must complete the permit to re-enroll here: graduate.ku.edu/permit-re-enroll
- If you have not been enrolled for 4 or more semesters as a graduate student, you must complete a graduate application as described in this packet.

Non-degree Music Programs: Required Documents for Regular Admission

Non-degree seeking students must submit the graduate application, application fee, and appropriate items as listed below according to the specific status requested. International students are typically not admitted as non-degree students. Please contact International Student Services for additional information at 785-864-3617 or iss@ku.edu.

- ❑ Non-degree “Regular”: Applicants must have a 3.0 GPA or higher and submit one official transcript from their undergraduate institution showing a conferred bachelor’s degree or equivalent.
- ❑ Non-degree “Provisional”: Applicants must have a 2.75-2.99 GPA and submit one official transcript from their undergraduate institution showing a conferred bachelor’s degree or equivalent.
- ❑ Non-degree “Easy Admit”: Applicants must present at least evidence of receipt of a baccalaureate degree from an accredited institution, to take one course per semester, without needing to meet the additional requirements for a regular non-degree admission. This category is limited to enrollment in short or continuing education courses, institutions, workshops, or certificates in graduate studies. Admission and enrollment for “Easy Admits” are not done online but through a special registration ticket (\$10.00 fee, subject to change) process.

NOTE: Music Degree applications cannot be admitted until all application requirements have been met and a satisfactory audition has been reported to the School of Music Graduate Services Office.

International Students Only: Additional Required Documents for Regular Admission

Acceptable *verification of English proficiency* can be done by one of the following methods.

1. Graduation with a baccalaureate degree (or higher) earned in residence from an accredited English-medium U.S. college or university or a college or university in the United Kingdom, Australia, New Zealand, Ireland, English-speaking province of Canada, or an English-speaking Caribbean country, with instruction conducted in English. Degrees earned online may not be used to verify English proficiency.
2. Receipt of official copy from ETS (not student's copy) of applicant's TOEFL scores achieved not more than two years prior to the semester of admission. Please see the information below.
3. Receipt of official copy of the ACADEMIC format of the [International English Language Testing System \(IELTS\)](#) administered by the University of Cambridge ESOL not more than two years prior to the semester of admission. Please see the information below.

*Admitted students will take the Applied English Center English Proficiency Test and may be required to enroll in one or more Applied English Center courses if they have:

- Any part of the paper-based TOEFL below 57 or an essay score below 5;
- Any part of the computer-based TOEFL below 23 or an essay score below 5;
- Any part of the internet-based TOEFL below 23;
- An IELTS overall score below 6.5 or any score below 6.0.

** *The iBT speaking score is not required for admission, but Graduate Teaching Assistant (GTA) applicants must have a minimum iBT speaking score of 22 or a TSE score of 50 to hold a GTA appointment.*

International students applying for a graduate teaching assistantship (GTA) must submit the test results for either the Speaking Proficiency English Assessment Kit (SPEAK) – 50; or the Test of Spoken English (TSE) – 50; or the Test of English as a Foreign Language Internet Based Test (TOEFL iBT) spoken English component – 22; or the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) spoken English component - 8 with their Graduate Teaching Assistantship application. Financial requirements for international students:

- An official Financial Statement showing equal to or greater than \$30,398 U.S. (academic year) must be submitted with the applicant materials. (*Amount is subject to change*). If the student's name is not indicated on the financial statement a letter of sponsorship or an affidavit of support must also be submitted noting the sponsor's name, date of birth, and the name of the student they will be sponsoring financially. If a fellowship or assistantship is offered, the amount of the stipend is deducted from the total amount required.

MORE INFORMATION ON TRANSCRIPTS:

If you are admitted to a program, and accept the offer, you will be required to submit an official transcript for GPA and degree conferral verification by your **second semester of enrollment**. In order for transcripts to be considered official, they must be sent directly from the institution. **KU does not consider transcripts that come from applicants or that have been in the applicant's possession as official.** You may be admitted with the transcript you uploaded to the application; however, Graduate Admissions must receive your official transcript - sent directly from your institution – before you will be permitted to enroll for your second semester of courses.

The official transcript must show that your undergraduate degree has been conferred.

The official transcript must be in a sealed envelope issued from the institution or sent electronically from the institution. **There are no exceptions.** The transcript hold will not be removed until the transcript is received in a sealed envelope or received electronically directly from the institution.

Transcripts that are in a language other than English must be accompanied with English translations. Applicants with degrees from India or China must also provide a copy of their diploma and/or certificate.

AUDITION PROCEDURES AND INFORMATION

AUDITION DEADLINES

- Audition request forms must be in no later than 3 weeks prior to the requested audition date.
- Pre-screening audition for all graduate voice and piano applicants must be received by **December 1**.

PRESCREENING SUBMISSION for **voice** and **piano** applicants:

If you are applying as a voice or piano major, you must submit a pre-screening CD or DVD online at www.musiccas.com. By using this online program you are assured of our receiving your pre-screening audition. Please follow the instructions carefully. For priority consideration, please have your pre-screening media submitted by **December 1**.

AUDITION REQUIREMENTS BY INSTRUMENT

BRASS AND PERCUSSION

TRUMPET: Candidates for the **MM in Performance** or the **DMA in Performance** should contact Steve Leisring directly regarding audition repertoire choices and requirements. Generally, candidates should be prepared to present at least 20 minutes of standard repertoire that best demonstrates the candidate's current level. This should include works performed on Bb and C trumpet and additional keyed instruments if possible. Candidates interested in Graduate Assistantships will be required to demonstrate ability on the Piccolo and/or Eb trumpet as well. Use of an accompaniment is optional for the audition. Emphasis will be on evaluating the quality of the audition performance over the difficulty of the works performed.

Tenor Trombone: 1) Excerpts: *Bolero*; *William Tell*; *Mahler 3*, solos 1 and 2 from Mvt. 1; Wagner, "Prelude Act III" from *Lohengrin*. 2) Solos: select two from the following: De Meij *T-Bone Concerto*, mvt. 1; Casterede *Sonatine*, mvt. 1; Rabe, *Basta*; Handel/LaFosse *Concerto in F Minor*, mvts. 1 and 2; Grondahl, *Concerto*, mvt. 1; Bozza, *Ballade*.

EUPHONIUM: **MM in Performance** – a 20 to 30 minute audition consisting of contrasting major works for the instrument, including transcriptions, and 2-3 major wind band excerpts. **DMA in Performance** – a 30 to 40 minute audition consisting of contrasting major works for the instrument, including transcriptions, and 2-3 wind band excerpts.

TUBA: **MM in Performance** – a 20-30 minute audition consisting of contrasting major works for the instrument, including transcriptions, and 2-3 major orchestral excerpts. **DMA in Performance** – a 30-40 minute audition consisting of contrasting major works for the instrument, including transcriptions, and 2-3 major orchestral excerpts.

PERCUSSION: All applicants for the **MM in Performance** or the **DMA in Performance** must perform in *all major areas listed below*. This list is the minimum required audition for the graduate level. Feel free to prepare anything else you would like to play for auditions.

ORGAN, CARILLON, AND CHURCH MUSIC

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS: Candidates for the **MM in Performance (Organ or Carillon)**, **MM in Church Music (Organ or Choral)**, **DMA in Performance (Organ)**, or the **DMA in Church Music (Organ or Choral)** should contact the faculty member listed below directly regarding audition repertoire choices and requirements. Organ auditions consist of a day-long visit, tour of the facilities, and audition.

PIANO

PRESCREENING: A *pre-screening submission via www.musiccas.com is required for all graduate programs in Piano (MM or DMA)*. Students must submit a 30-minute audition of their performances of: the first movement of a Classical sonata, a major Romantic work, plus other works of the applicant's choice. The recording does not have to be professional quality, but should be a clear and accurate representation of your playing. Poor sound quality will lessen your chances of admission. Pre-screening submission will not be evaluated until your application is complete.

DEADLINE: Priority consideration prescreening submission is due by **December 1**.

AUDITION REQUIREMENTS AND REPERTOIRE: A 45-minute program with works from at least four style periods. The program must include: 1) a complete multi-movement sonata by a Classical composer, up to and including Schubert; 2) a major Romantic work; and 3) a virtuoso etude.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS: If audition requirements are not listed here, please contact the faculty member listed below for specific audition requirements and repertoire for **MM and DMA** programs.

VIOLIN MM and DMA audition requirements:

- Two contrasting movements from a solo Sonata or Partita by J.S. Bach
- The first movement of a standard concerto with cadenza OR the second and third movements of a standard concerto
- A contrasting piece (applicant's choice)

VOICE AND OPERA

PRESCREENING: A *pre-screening submission via www.musiccas.com is required for all graduate programs in Voice and Opera (MM and DMA)*. The submission must include a minimum of five selections, including one piece each in French, German, Italian, and English. Please include at least one aria.

DEADLINE: Priority consideration prescreening submission is due by **December 1**.

AUDITION REQUIREMENTS AND REPERTOIRE: Students auditioning for the **MM in Voice or Opera** are expected to present a maximum of six selections covering the major languages (French, German, Italian, English), including an aria from either an oratorio or opera.

Students auditioning for the **DMA in Voice** must present a full 60-minute recital including a variety of representative songs and areas covering the major languages. For more information, contact:

WOODWINDS

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS: **MM in Performance** candidates are to prepare a 30-minute program from which approximately 15 minutes of music will be chosen. **DMA in performance** candidates are to prepare a 60-minute program from which approximately 30 minutes of music will be chosen.

REPERTOIRE: Selections should demonstrate a variety of playing styles and compositional periods and represent the candidate's performance skills in the best possible light. The major teacher and one other member of the woodwind faculty will hear the audition. The audition need not be accompanied. A complete list of repertoire studied, including past programs, should be furnished at the time of the audition. Prospective students may submit a CD of a recent recital for advisory purposes. Final acceptance will be based upon a personal audition. *International students may submit a CD for their final audition if traveling to the US is not possible.*
